GUIDELINES FOR ACCREDITED MEDIA

- Media must wear, and have visible, the appropriate accreditation pass at all times in the game venue
- > Accreditation is not transferable
- Media must conduct their work solely from within the designated areas determined by the NBL and the home Club at each venue and adhere to any reasonable request by NBL or the Home Club media liaison in relation to conduct and work place.
- Working space on media benches courtside or within the venue will be allocated by the NBL Media Manager and the Home Club Media Liaison



 Accreditation is reserved for working media only. If accreditation is used in an inappropriate manner, it can be withdrawn at any time.

GUIDELINES FOR ACCREDITED PHOTOGRAPHERS

- Photographers must wear their accreditation pass and official photographer's vest issued by the NBL Media Manager or Host Club media liaison at all times in the venue
- No photographer may enter the field of play
- Specific courtside photographer positions
 will be assigned by the NBL and Home Club
 Game Day Manager / Media Liaison
- Any special photographic requests are to be directed to the NBL Media Manager or Home Club Media Liaison, who will confirm and arrange access to players, coaches and event officials in a timely manner
- Photographers may only take editorial images at NBL matches. Accreditation will not be granted to photographers who wish to use material for their own commercial or promotional purposes and accreditation can be withdrawn at any time on notice of this occurring



SPECIAL BROADCAST CONDITIONS

- ESPN and SKY Sport (NZ) are permitted to film or commentate on NBL matches within official venues in NZ and Australia
- News crews are permitted to film the official post-match press conferences but are not permitted to film the games / action, unless prior permission has been granted
- News crews can submit requests for player / coach interviews prior to the game commencing with interviews agreed at the discretion of the NBL
- The use of all Television or photographic cameras and radio broadcast equipment must be approved by the NBL Media Manager before entering the venue
- No radio commentary or audio streaming of any match is permitted unless through prior agreement with the Home Club Media Liaison and NBL Media Manager
- Live streaming inside official NBL venues by teams, media outlets and social media personnel (bloggers, NBL forums) is strictly prohibited.
 Only NBL Media and NBL representatives are permitted to live stream inside the venue
